<u>Maths</u>: We will begin the term by continuing our work on 'Multiplication and Division'. The children have been taught that the mathematical symbol **x** means 'equal groups of' and that ÷ means 'shared between' or 'grouped into'. We will focus on the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, and include work on doubling and halving. We will then move on to studying 'length', 'mass', 'capacity' and 'temperature'. Within all topics, we will be using our skills to problem solve, explain our thinking and reasoning, and develop a range of effective strategies for calculating answers.

Reading:

We will be continuing to practise our VIPRS skills.

- V = Understanding Vocabulary.
- I = Inferring information from what has been read.
- P = Predicting what might happen next.
- R = Retrieval questions to find answers in the text.
- S = Summarising and sequencing the text to

explain what has happened and what it is about.
